Educators at this level are responsible for designing and implementing curriculum that meets the requirements of an approved learning framework and for maintaining compliance in other areas of service operations.

They use specialised knowledge and analyse and apply theoretical concepts to diverse work situations. They may have responsibility for supervision of volunteers or other educators.

Early childhood educators may work in long day care centres, family day care, pre-schools or kindergartens.

Studying via a Traineeship

- Be an Australian Citizen, a New Zealand passport holder or hold a visa that allows you to engage in work in Australia.

- A Working with Children Check (WWCC) will be required for employment purposes.
